### **April - November**

Clitheroe Canoe Club has regular club sessions at our facility in Chatburn on Saturday afternoons.

Clitheroe Canoe Club is a not-for profit club based at our purpose built facility Chatburn Water, on the outskirts of Chatburn near Clitheroe, Lancashire.

### **Our Aims**

The club's primary objective is to promote the sport of canoeing to residents and visitors to the Ribble Valley and surrounding areas.

### **Our Members**

We are a family oriented canoe club with particular emphasis on making canoe sport available to young people. We welcome anyone who would like to try canoeing or kayaking.

### **Our Coaches**

As a member club of the British Canoe Union, our coaches are trained to BCU standards. Coaching is provided within BCU guidelines and members' levels of achievement are measured through the BCU star test awards scheme.

### **Our Facilities**

The club can provide you with all the kit you will need. We have a large selection of kayaks, paddles, cagoules, buoyancy aids, spray decks, and helmets for use. Our clubhouse boasts changing rooms with hot showers, and access and changing and showering facilities for people with disabilities.

### **Group Bookings**

Groups can be catered for by special arrangement on weekday evenings and weekend days or evenings.

Options include sessions designed for kids or grown ups, and a special session for grown ups which includes a meal at The Brown Cow pub in Chatburn.

### **Open Days**

Each year, the club holds open days. These are an excellent opportunity for people to have a go and use the club's facilities free of charge. See our website, or local press for details and dates etc.
